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High above the Shenandoah Valley in the Blue Ridge Mountains, less than a mile from Blue Ridge Parkway milepost 27, is a haven of natural beauty called the Sugar Tree. Set on twenty-eight wooded acres at 2800 feet, Virginia's Mountain Inn is a place of rustic elegance, peace and tranquility.

In the Fall, the landscape is brilliant with color: yellow, rust, orange and scarlet from the foliage of the hardwood forest. The Spring blooms with fragrance and color as the rhododendron, mountain laurel, trillium and dogwood flowers appear. Nature encompasses the Inn as habitants of the woods include deer, hummingbirds, hawks, chipmunks and raccoons.

Relax from the moment you arrive. Pick a rocker on our broad front porch, settle in with the forty mile views and let the quiet soothe away your workday stresses. Watch a hummingbird (or ten) as they dart from the porch feeders to the dogwoods below. As evening falls, enjoy a spectacular sunset and then marvel at the stars as night encompasses the mountains.

Enjoy the individual personality of your room or suite, all with private baths and chairs by the wood-burning fireplaces, as well as personally controlled heating/air conditioning. You will sleep in rustic elegance with comfortable beds and country quilts. Some rooms indulge you further with whirlpool tubs, ceiling fans, VCRs (and video tapes), separate sitting rooms and outside decks for relaxing on a sunny afternoon.

Before you turn in, perhaps you would like to stargaze while relaxing in our hot tub on the mountainside deck. Then light your wood fire and pull up a chair. Dive into a book from our eclectic upstairs library or choose a game to play. When you start to nod, climb into the comfort of your bed for a night of unbroken sleep that comes so effortlessly in the peace of our mountains.

Accommodations

Our thirteen rooms are divided between five buildings, each having its own very special "feel".

The Main Lodge

Our Main Lodge houses three King Bedrooms, our lobby with a two story, hand laid stone fireplace & dining facilities. Rooms in the Lodge enjoy the full length covered porch with our 40 mile views. Wifi ready.



Sugar Tree Country

Honoring our own Sugar Tree name, this premium 2nd floor Lodge room features a King bed, vaulted ceiling with fan, VCR and double whirlpool tub across from the wood burning fireplace. It has a shower in the bathroom and features a full mountain view. \$198



Tye River

Named for our mountain river gap, this 2nd floor, warm, romantic room features a King bed, wood burning stone fireplace, VCR, and vaulted ceiling with a fan. It has a traditional tub/shower bath and a limited mountain view. \$178



Crabtree Falls

Saluting the highest set of falls in the Southeast, this room features a King bed, wood burning stone fireplace and VCR. It has a traditional tub/shower bath and is conveniently located on the main floor with a limited mountain view. \$168

It features a wood burning stove, VCR, and an outside sitting deck to enjoy the sights and sound of our Creek.

Children under 12 are welcome here. Breakfast, in the Lodge will be included for adults and well behaved children over 12. \$178 for two. \$25 extra for each additional person.

Reservations: Generally, weekend reservations require a two night minimum. You may call and ask if a one night stay is available.

Calls: Accepted from 10:00 AM - 9:00 PM EST.

Deposits: Reservations are confirmed upon receipt of one night's deposit. A 14 day cancellation notice is required for a full refund. Within 14 days, the room must be re-rented for receive a refund. A \$25 cancellation fee will be applied to all cancellations.

Children: Sugar Tree is most appropriate for adults; however we do accommodate responsible children over 12.

Dining: A full country breakfast for two is included with the room rates.

Directions

From Highway 81: Take Exit 205, the Steeles Tavern exit. Proceed east on Highway 606 one and a half miles to Highway 11 where you turn left and then immediately right on Highway 56. Follow Highway 56 approximately 4.5 miles through Vesuvius, left across the RR tracks and through the George Washington National Forest to the Sugar Tree Inn sign on your right.

From the Blue Ridge Parkway: Exit at Milepost 27 for Steeles Tavern and proceed 0.9 miles west on Highway 56 to the Sugar Tree Inn sign on your left.

From our Sign: Head down our long winding road beneath the towering oaks and hemlocks, through a switch back turn, over the bridge and up our hill to the Inn.
